Disinfection (disinfection and chlorination, sodium hypochlorite, chlorine, ozonation, radiation disinfection (UV)). Electrical / maintenance (electrical theory, safety, pump theory, valves, preventive maintenance). 🔎 Basic wastewater collection (collection system operations, pumping stations, hydraulics, piping, valves, distribution system maintenance).
